We are Temples of Christ.

Ezekiel 47:1-2,8-9,12. Psalm 45. I Corinthians 3:9-11,16-17. John 2:13-22.

You might well wonder why the dedication of a church is being given precedence over celebrating the 32nd Sunday of the year which is the Lord's day. Well the Lateran Basilica in Rome is no ordinary church. When it was built it in 324AD, Pope Sylvester dedicated it as his Cathedral in Rome. (St. Peter's Basilica is a basilica built over the tomb of St. Peter the Apostle.) So from the Lateran Basilica Pope Leo guides all the worldwide Church.

So what do the readings mean for us today?. They support the idea of blessing and fruitfulness flowing forth from the Temple. Ezekiel was writing at the time of the return of Jews from Babylonian captivity after the destruction of the first Temple. Now the people are rebuilding the temple and Ezekiel describes his vision, in which is depicted the blessing and fruitfulness that flows forth from the river flowing out the gates of the temple. (fresh fruit every month!)

Today's excerpt has been abbreviated, but it would be well worth your while to read the full chapter.

The second reading from 1. Corinthians 3:9-11 reminds us that each one of us is a temple of God, and together we form the Church (forget about an actual building) and from us should pour forth every kind of welcome and blessing and fruitfulness, just as in the temple Ezekiel envisioned.

By the time John's gospel was being written (90 AD) there was tension between Jews who had come to believe in Christ and those other Jews. Jesus, by his symbolic gesture in the temple, proclaimed that God's presence was no longer solely in the temple but in each one of us.

So where and when in the Church do you experience abundance of blessing? In your own life, do those who come in touch with you experience welcome and blessing? What one thing could you do to change things for the better?

Lord, Please grant us the wisdom to know what to do, and the courage to do it.
