TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD LIKE THEM TO TREAT YOU

In today's gospel we hear Jesus' teaching on how we should live our lives. The first example "love your enemies" is exemplified in the first reading when David who is being pursued by king Saul who wants to kill him, comes into king Saul's camp at night and has the opportunity of killing Saul, but instead takes his sword and water pitcher (as proof that he was there) and leaves the king alive as he would not raise his hand against God' chosen king. David has done the honourable thing.

In the second reading St. Paul is answering a letter sent to him by the people of Corinth. It seems that some of the Christian community, whilst believing in the resurrection of Christ, still do not believe that they too will rise from the dead. Throughout the long 15th Chapter, Paul argues the fact that because Christ is truly risen we too will rise. We have been hearing it over the past number of weeks. It is difficult to make sense of it in tiny snippets, but it is well worth reading the complete chapter. Our belief in the resurrection is a very precious gift, and we should do all we can to nourish it. (1Corinthians Chapter 15)

The image that Luke offers us in today's gospel calls for great generosity of spirit; "love your enemies, give to everyone who asks you, be compassionate, do not judge, do not condemn". "Treat others as you would like them to treat you" and do it all without seeking any reward. But you will be rewarded. God will never be outdone in generosity "a full measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap".
