As sharers in the Eucharist, we become involved in the mission and message of Jesus who bridges the gulf that leaves people estranged and alienated. A trap was set for Jesus in the gospel with the question, 'which is the greatest commandment of the

law?' He was asked this because he created fellowship with people wherever he met them. He showed an indiscriminate generosity and willingness to mix with all sorts of people who were judged to be undesirable, shadowy and unsuitable company. This is expressed in his answer: 'You must love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.'
