### "BEHIND THE SCENES".

Now and again it is quite useful to have a look behind the scenes. We never know what we'll discover!

Behind Jeremiah's doom and gloom, for which he is well known – and valued – lies optimism. No matter how dreadful a situation, God's providence will always save it: "...but the remnant of my flock I myself will gather....and will bring them back to their pastures". (Jeremiah 23:1-6) A more obscure message can be made out behind the scenes in St Paul's letter. Two groups, separated by hostility and barriers (here Jews and Gentiles) means trouble and strife. It is something with which we are only too familiar in many areas of life. Through Christ, however, comes "peace to those who were far away ('them') and peace to those who are near at hand ('us)". (Ephesians 2:13-18).

The Gospel describes how Jesus and his apostles are sought out at every turn. They cannot get away from the crowds, not even to get something to eat. You'd have to feel sorry for them. What was it like behind the scenes? Tiredness can cause the most awful, unintended behaviour, blame, cruel words etc. and remember the ad. – "You're not yourself when you're hungry"! Again it is Jesus who saves the day. "You must rest a while" he tells them, (not "we must rest a while"). A little later in the story, he sees the pressing, demanding crowds again on the shore. "He took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd" We can only imagine what that was like behind the scenes. Why were they there? (Mark 6:30-34)

This brings us neatly to the Psalm, the best known and loved, perhaps, of all psalms. A tranquil, sunny picture of green pastures, quiet streams, easy paths, banquets. But is this it? When do we turn to this psalm? Not surely on warm, calm days but on cold, troubled days when we are lost in grief or astray with worry. This is what lies behind the scenes of Psalm 23. The wonderful 2<sup>nd</sup> verse sums up the whole "hidden treasure" of today's Scripture readings. It says **everything.** 

He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name.

If I should walk in the valley of darkness, no evil would I fear.

You are there with your crook and your staff, with these you give me comfort.

Isn't it nice to think that Jesus and his apostles may well have turned to this psalm in their exhausted state? May we, like them, constantly rediscover God's unwavering, care for us.
