PARALLEL LIVES.

We rarely find ourselves celebrating St Patrick on a Sunday in Lent. The exceptional occasion this year highlights interesting, thought-provoking features.

The Scripture passages for this 5th Lenten Sunday take us right through God's relationship with humanity. **Jeremiah** describes the move from a powerful, punishing, angry God to a "new covenant" with a forgiving, redeeming God. **The Psalmist** prays for "a pure heart" and "a spirit of fervour to sustain". **St Paul** emphasizes Christ's own submission to the will of the Father, his reliance on prayer and the daunting phrase "he learnt to obey through suffering". In **John's Gospel** the culmination of the life of Jesus resides in the phrase "For anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life". Whether we're talking about "nowadays" or centuries ago, this is an alien and alienating idea. Why would anyone subscribe to it? Even Jesus acknowledges "My soul is troubled. What shall I say?" Then "Father, glorify your name" is his answer; it's the only possible one. And the response from Heaven? "I have glorified it and will glorify it again". This is the key – and the last part involves us. Finally, the essence of all that we, as Christians, believe is defined in the sentence "When I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself". The triumph of Love is seen on the Cross. Death becomes Life; Loss becomes Gain.

If we align the life of St Patrick with that of Jesus, the parallels are clear — solitude, hardship, prayer, despair, uncertainty, and ultimately the selfless submission of self for the glory of God. Patrick read these same Scriptures in 432 AD as we do this morning. He made his choices. Are we making the same ones? There is no better way to honour our national saint. We owe him our identity as Irish, something precious, and important to preserve!

Our song this morning: "We are thankful we are Patrick's people, let us follow the path he chose"
